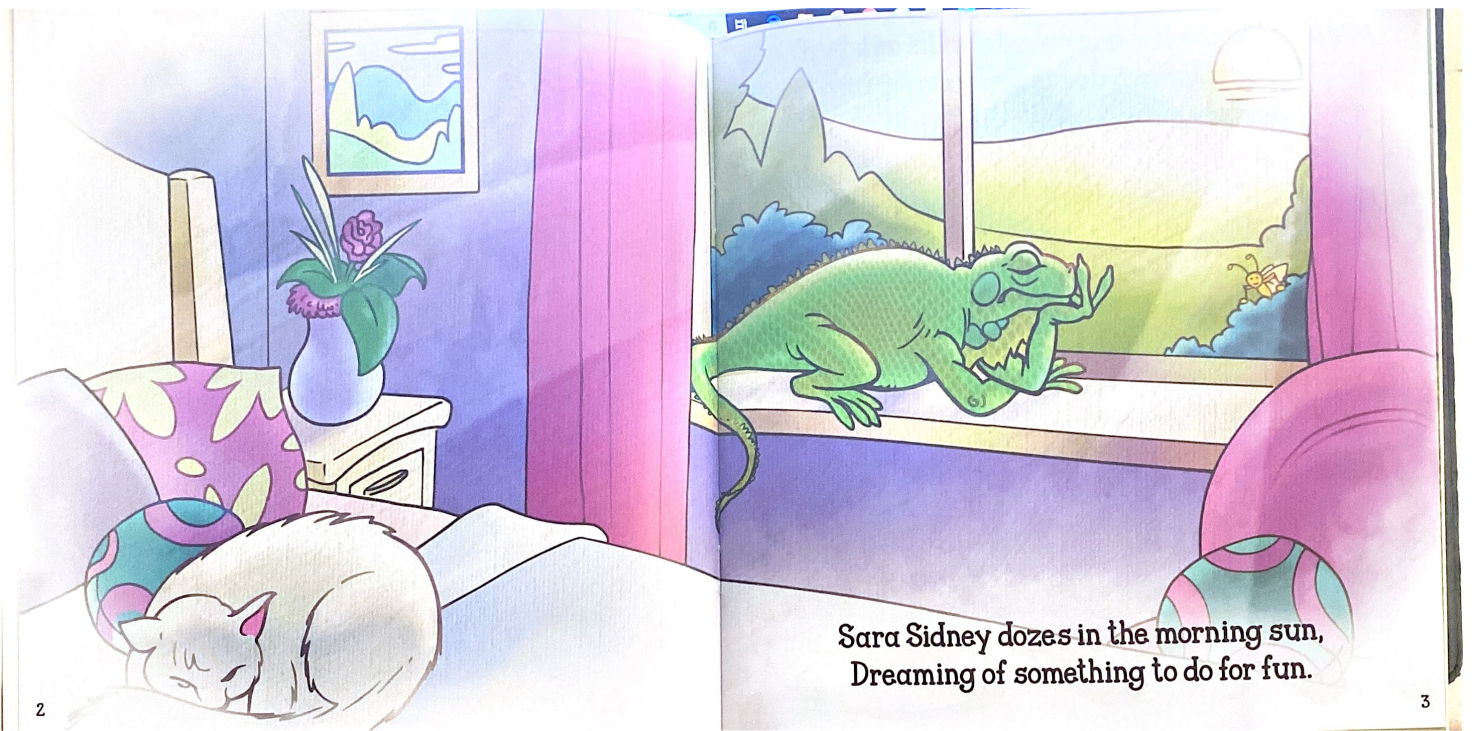

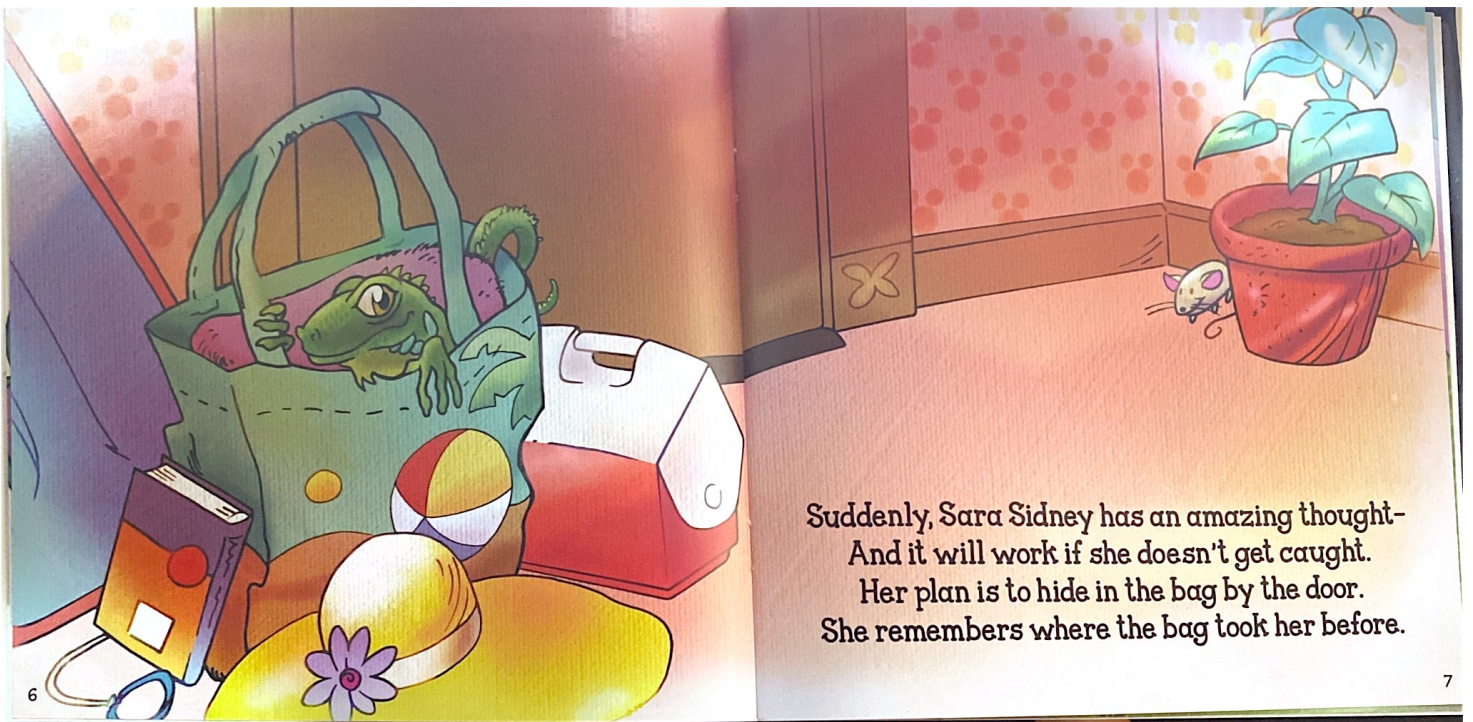


Maybe she can entertain the cat
With a cha-cha dance and a funny hat.



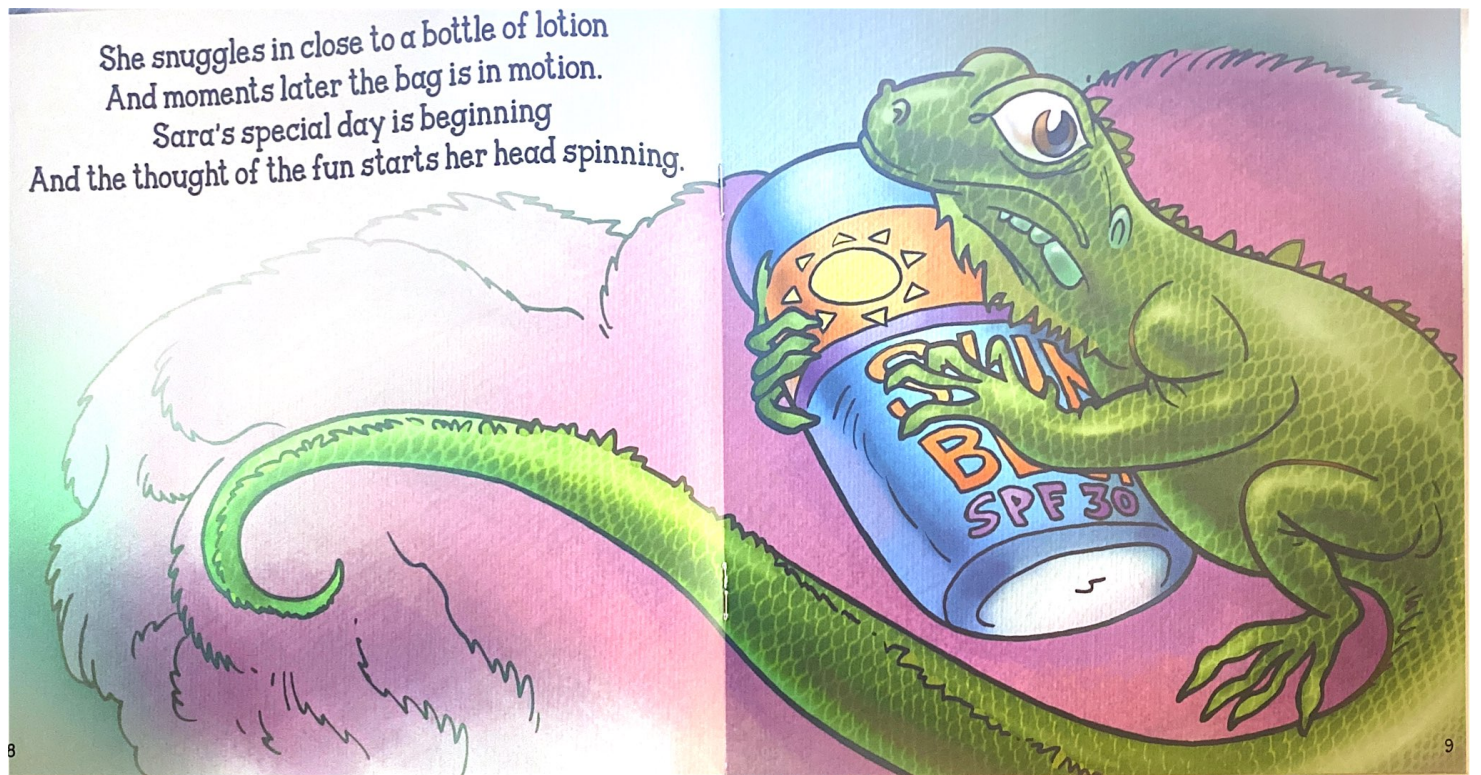
Or shake things up with her electric guitar,
Striking the chords like a famous rock star.



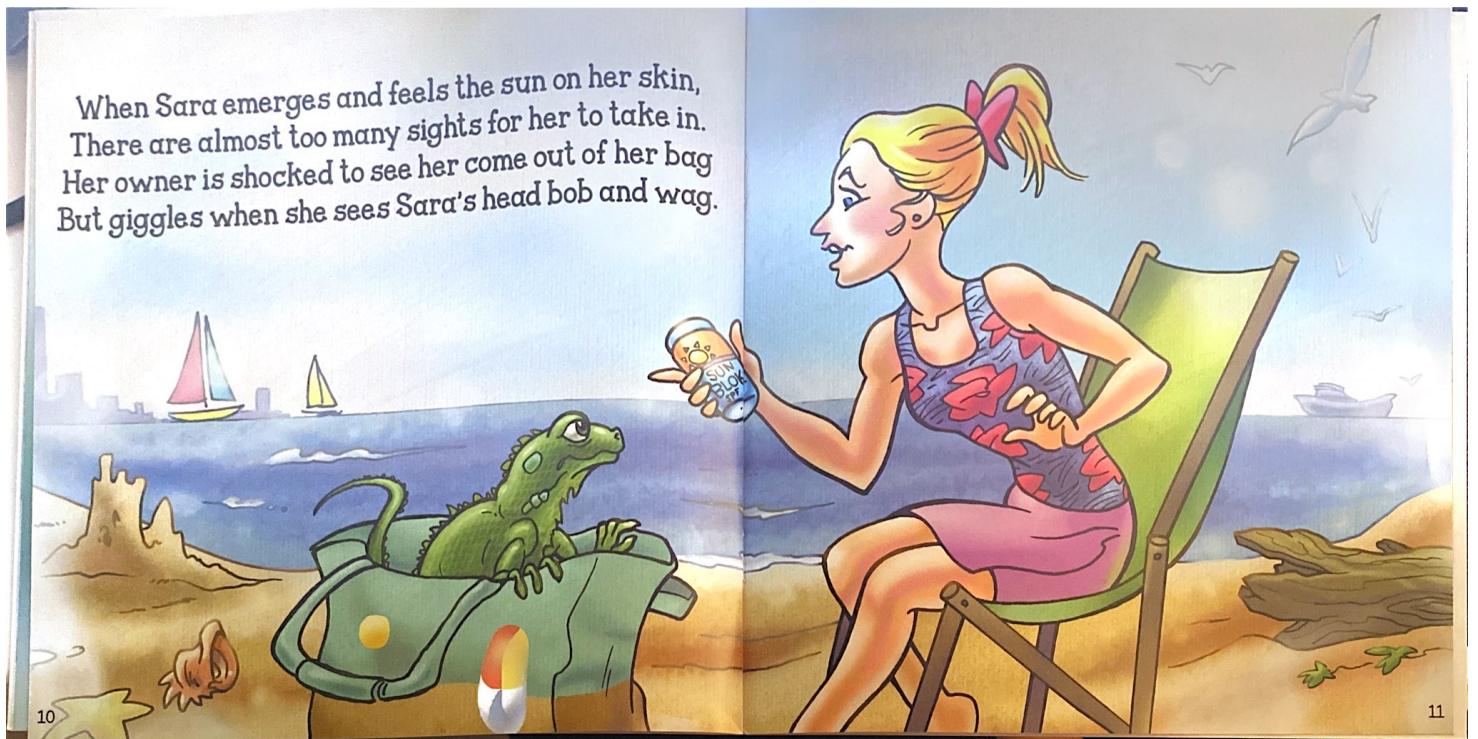


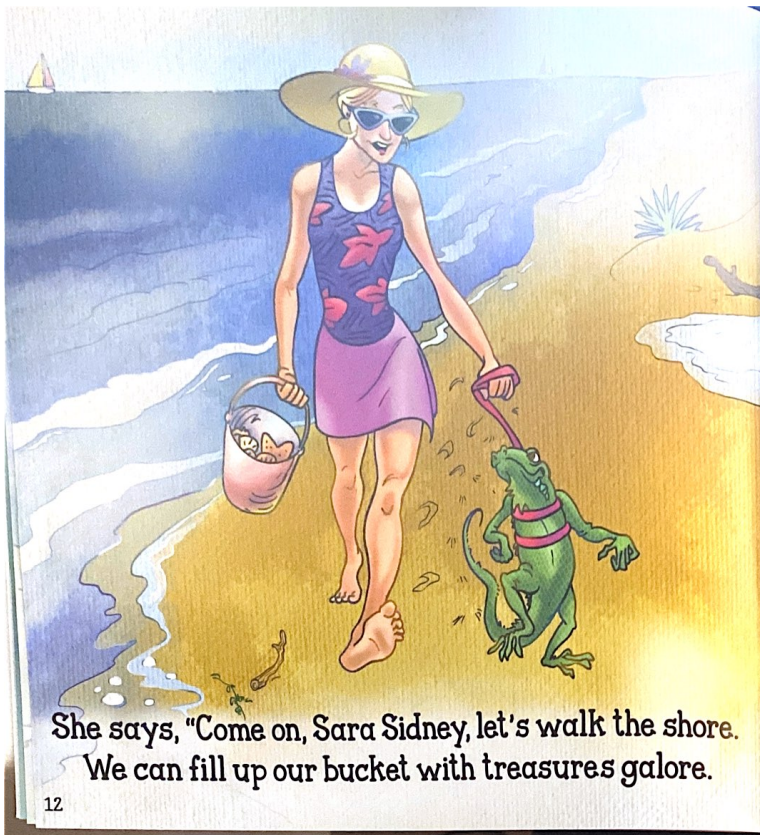
Suddenly, Sara Sidney has an amazing thought-

And the thought of the fun starts her head spinning.

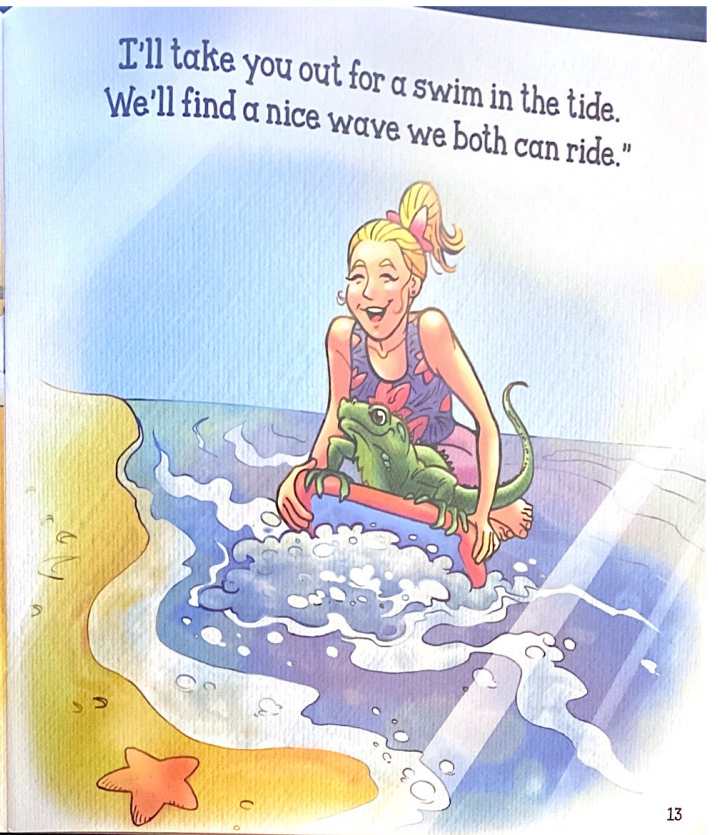


When Sara emerges and feels the sun on her skin,

But giggles when she sees Sara's head bob and wag.

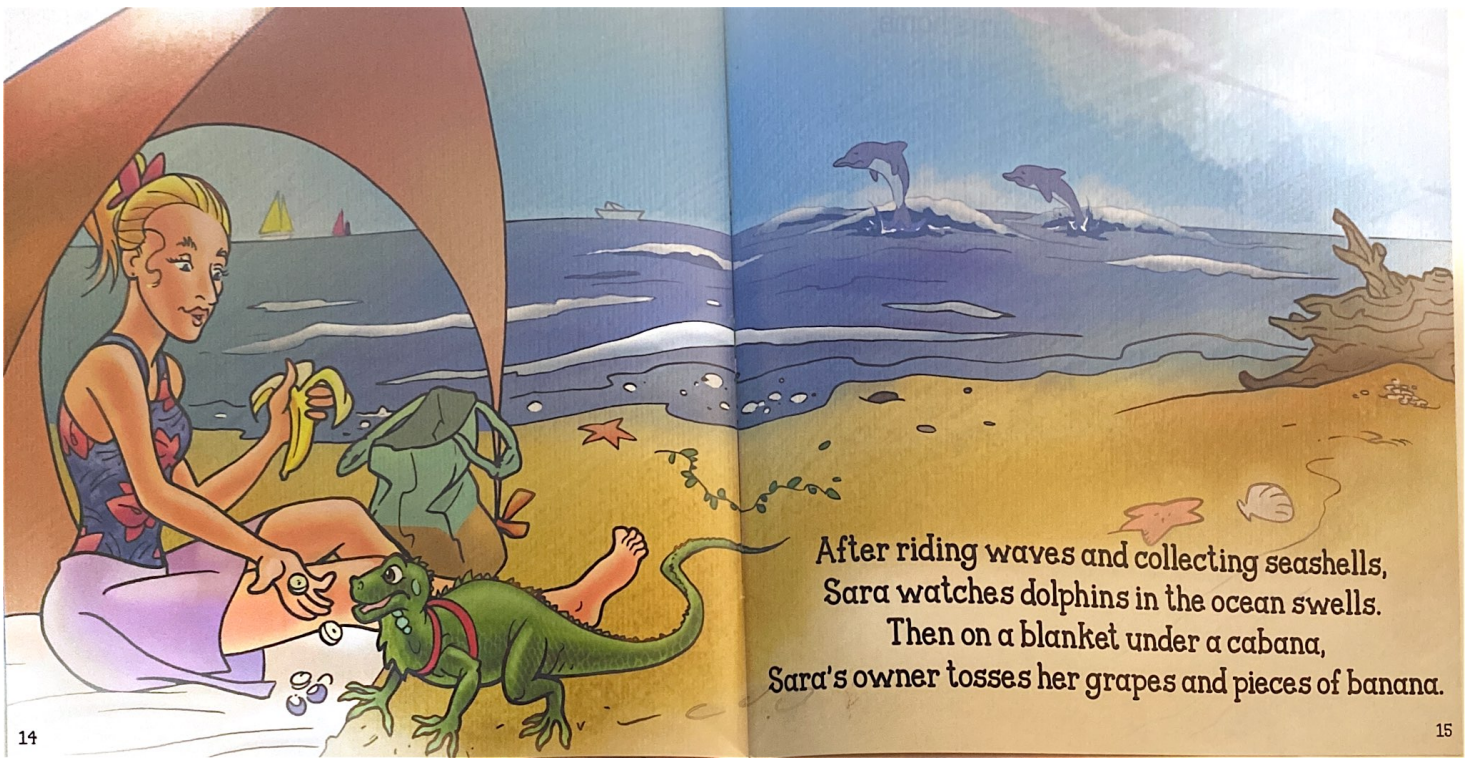




She says, "Come on, Sara Sidney, let's walk the shore.
We can fill up our bucket with treasures galore."

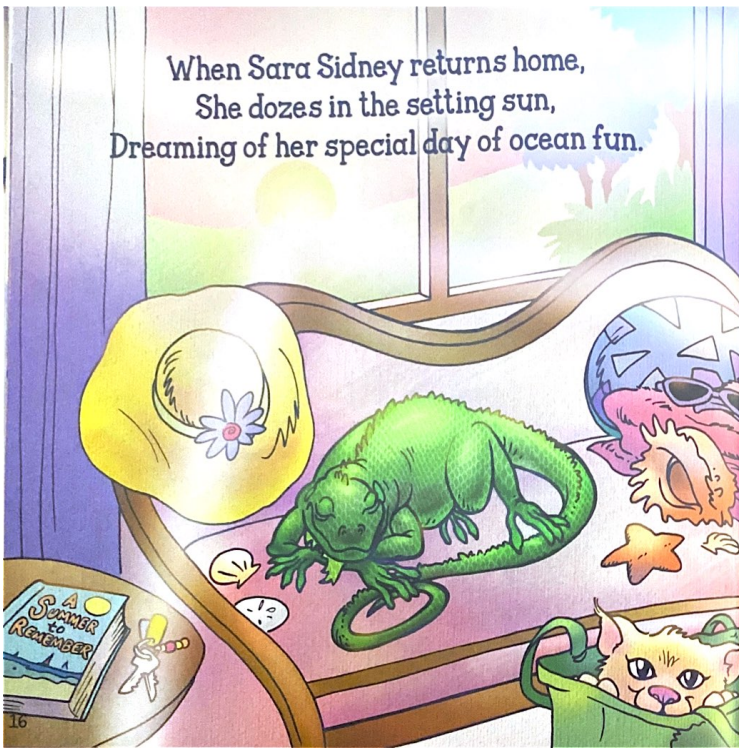


I'll take you out for a swim in the tide.
